

## **Code of Conduct**

Updated July 2024

## Any member may be disqualified from an NDHSRA or NHSRA event/rodeo for any of the following offenses:

- Having any association with alcoholic beverages, narcotic, tobacco products or other nonmedicinal drugs while in attendance at any approved High School or Junior High Rodeo or sanctioned activity. Whether at a motel, on rodeo grounds, or going to or from the rodeo or at any NHSRA function. The member <u>will be suspended</u> from further rodeo activity for <u>six</u> <u>weeks</u>. If they are disqualified for any of these offenses, they will be disqualified from all events or other participation in the rodeo, NHSRA event, or other function.
- Rowdyism, quarreling or fighting in the actual domain of the arena at any time, or any place during the duration of the Rodeo.
- Conduct or speech of any kind detrimental to the best interests of the NHSRA, NDHSRA, or the sport of rodeo while in attendance, or coming to and going home from a rodeo.
- Motel or property damage by contestants or their associates; damage must be reported to the NDHSRA President and/or National Director. If damage is not reported, contestants will be banned from the High School Rodeo Association permanently and reported to law authorities for prosecution.
- Contestants will be disqualified for vandalism at any place or any time.
- Cheating or attempting to cheat.
- Any contestants or parents attempting to fix, threaten, bribe, influence, harass or coerce any rodeo official at any time.
- Missing any mandatory meeting, safety seminar, or equipment check.
